Future Continuous

(for actions that will be ongoing at a specific time in the future)

**will + be +
Present Participle
(Ving)**

Future Continuous

1) To describe something in progress at a specific future time:

e.g. At 8 PM tomorrow, I'll be studying for my exam.

e.g. This time next week, I'll be traveling to Paris.

Future Continuous Markers

- **From [time] to [time]:**

e.g. I'll be working from 9 AM to 5 PM tomorrow.

- **Between [time] and [time]:**

e.g. She'll be studying between 2 PM and 4 PM.

- **At [specific time]:**

e.g. At 11 PM I'll be sleeping.

- **This time next [week/month/year]**

e.g. This time next month I'll be flying to Vienna.

Future Continuous

2. To describe something that will happen in the normal course of events, not as part of a plan.

In this case we'll be speaking about actions that are simply expected or routine, without any deliberate planning or special intention.

e.g. I'll be shopping for groceries later, so I can buy some milk.

e.g. I'll be seeing my boss tomorrow, so I can bring up this question.

e.g. I'll be walking past the library later, and I can return your book if you like.

Future Perfect

(for actions that will be completed before
a specific time in the future)

**will + have
+ Past Participle**

e.g. I'll have finished this report by the end of the week.

Future Perfect Markers

- **by [a specific time]**
- **before [a specific time]**

e.g. I'll have cleaned the house by 3 PM tomorrow.

e.g. By the time you arrive, we'll have prepared dinner.

e.g. I'll have submitted the task before nine.



Modals with Future Continuous

Modal + be + -ing (present participle)

e.g. I might be working late tomorrow, so I'll let you know if I can join the meeting.

e.g. I guess she could be traveling next week.

e.g. He must be sleeping now since his flight was overnight.

e.g. Around 2 PM they should be preparing for their presentation



Modals with Future Perfect

Modal + have + past participle

e.g. They must have finished the project by tomorrow afternoon.

e.g. She should have submitted the application by Friday.

e.g. By the time you get home, I might have cooked dinner.

e.g. The documents may have been signed by the time we meet.
