# QUANTIFIERS

*some/any/no, much/many,  
little/few, all/enough etc.*



# Uncountable / Plural Nouns

## **100% (All, Any)**

e.g. *All students passed the test.*

e.g. *You can take any advice you find helpful.*

## **A Large Amount (A lot of, Lots of, Plenty of, Most)**

e.g. *There is a lot of sugar in the jar.*

e.g. *Most people enjoy music.*

e.g. *She has plenty of experience in teaching.*

## **A Small Amount (Some, Hardly Any)**

e.g. *There is some milk left in the fridge.*

e.g. *Hardly any students attended the meeting.*

## **0% (No, Not any)**

e.g. *There is no water in the bottle.*

e.g. *I don't have any money left.*





# Uncountable Nouns

## **A Large Amount**

***(Much, A Large Amount Of, A Great Deal Of)***

*e.g. There isn't much time left.*

*e.g. She has a great deal of patience.*

*e.g. A large amount of information was shared.*

## **A Small Amount (A Little, Little)**

*e.g. I have a little sugar for the cake.*

*e.g. There is only little sugar left. (not enough)*





# Plural Nouns

## **100% (Both = All of Two)**

e.g. *Both of my parents are teachers.*

e.g. *Both options are available.*

## **A Large Number**

**(Many, A large number of, Quite a few)**

e.g. *She has many books in her collection.*

e.g. *A large number of tourists visit this city every year.*

e.g. *There are quite a few students in the library.*

## **A Small Number**

**(Several, A small number of, Few, A few)**

e.g. *A few people arrived early.*

e.g. *Few people arrived early. (not enough)*

e.g. *Several mistakes were found in the report.*





# Singular Nouns

## **100% (Each, Every, Any)**

e.g. *Each student must complete the test.*

e.g. *Every house in the street has a garden.*

e.g. *You can ask any question you like.*

## **0% (No, Not Any, Neither = None of Two)**

e.g. *No answer was correct.*

e.g. *I don't have any idea about that.*

e.g. *Neither option is suitable.*





# Special rules

- 1. 'Both' is used with plural verbs:**  
*e.g. Both of my parents work in healthcare.*
- 2. 'Neither' is used with singular verbs:**  
*e.g. Neither option is available.*
- 3. 'Another' is for singular nouns and numbers:**  
*e.g. Could I have another piece of cake?*  
*e.g. We have another two meetings today.*
- 4. 'Any' means it doesn't matter which one:**  
*e.g. You can take any seat - all of them are free!*
- 5. 'None' is used for short answers:**  
*e.g. How much sugar do we have? - None.*
